TribeHall February post report - Topic: Caring for Community

Community Question: What are the foundational elements of a safe and productive community?

Key Insights:

1. Core Values and Principles:

- Discussion on instilling language and agreed-upon community ideals through rituals.

- Acknowledgment of societal influences on chosen rites of passage rituals.
- Call to make space for less traditional family structures.
- Importance of balancing masculine and feminine energies beyond the household.
- Power of creating spaces for men and women to understand and support each other in defining family and rites of passage.

5. Community Language and Decolonization:

- Emphasis on decolonizing language within the community.
- Importance of defining understanding both within and outside the community.
- Acknowledgment of the need to create boundaries that foster connection and avoid disconnection.
